

WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit or certain emails you open. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide business and marketing information to the owners of the site. USE OF COOKIES BY THIS SITE

Three types of cookie may be used during your visit to our site:

- **Session cookies** that are deleted after each visit
- **Persistent cookies** are valid across visits and, for example, are used to avoid the need to tell us your country of residence at the start of each visit
- **Third party cookies** that are used by our business partners, for example, to help us manage site visitors.

Some of the cookies are essential in order for you to use the site.

COOKIES ON OUR SITE

Here is a list of all the cookies the site sets and how we use them.

Please be aware that, if you decline the use of cookies set by this site, you may not be able to use certain areas of this site.

Type of cookie, cookie name and cookie description:

- **Session cookie**
ASP.NET_SessionId
Used to maintain your transaction with Positive Solutions. Minimises the need to transfer your information across the Internet.
- **Persistent cookie**
UserAllowsOurCookies
This cookie allows the site to remember whether you accept our cookies or not.
- **Third party (Google Analytics)**
_utms, _utmb, _utmc, _utmz
These cookies help tell us how many people have been to the site before, what time people visited the site and what pages were looked at. No personal information is stored. For more information, see Google's help pages and Google's privacy policy.

- **Third party (LinkedIn)**

X-LI-IDC

Introduced by the LinkedIn share button. Used to track which pages the user visits to collect them. For more information visit LinkedIn's privacy policy page.

- **Third party (Twitter)**

pid

Introduced by the Twitter "tweet" button. For more information visit Twitter's privacy policy page.
